- Page three there seems to be a word missing in the Summary- *The guidelines explain the responsibility of podiatrists to maintain knowledge of his or her infective status and what podiatric procedures are considered to be exposure prone Procedures?*
- Page four Exposure-prone procedures-for example, spicules of bone or teeth, in body cavities or in poorly visualised or confined body sites, including the mouth of the patient or client
